



ITEC Level 2 Award in The Art of Dressing Hair QAN 500/9877/9 Specification

Aims and Objectives

The main aim of the ITEC Level 2 Award in The Art of Dressing Hair is to enable Learners to gain the necessary practical skills and knowledge required by the Hairdressing Industry. The qualification is suitable for Learners aged 16 and over and is designed to provide occupational competence at Level 2. It also provides a sound platform into further learning at Level 3

Content

This qualification is for Learners who want to work within the Hairdressing Industry. The qualification consists of 1 mandatory unit. The qualification must cover a minimum of 30 hours of Guided Learning (GL) to achieve the full qualification

The main skills the Learner will perform are:

- Dressing Hair - develop long Hairdressing skills to create a variety of looks, including setting and hair-up

This qualification also provides:

- Opportunities for Learners to focus on the development of the major functional skills and the wider functional skills in a hairdressing context, such as communicating with clients, working with others and problem solving
- Opportunities for Learners to develop a range of skills, techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for successful performance in employment as a Hairdresser

Why Choose the ITEC Level 2 Award in The Art of Dressing Hair?

1. This qualification contains the skills and knowledge required for undertaking the Art of Dressing Hair at Level 2 and can assist a Learner seeking employment or self-employment as a Hairdresser at Level 2
2. This Qualification is listed in the Ofqual Register of Qualifications
3. This qualification does not form part of an Apprenticeship
4. Learners may progress onto the ITEC Level 2 Diploma in Hairdressing 501/2254/X
5. This qualification is recognised by all relevant professional bodies within the Hairdressing Industry for membership and insurance purposes at Level 2

Guided Learning (GL)

Guided Learning is 'the activity of a Learner in being taught or instructed by – or otherwise participating in education or training under the immediate guidance or supervision of – a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'. This includes 'the activity of being assessed if the assessment takes place under the immediate guidance or supervision of a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'

Total Qualification Time (TQT)

Total Qualification Time is the number of notional hours which represents an estimate of the total amount of time that could reasonably be expected to be required in order for a Learner to achieve and demonstrate the achievement of the level of attainment necessary for the award of the qualification

Total Qualification Credit Value

The total Credit Value for the qualification is equal to one tenth of the Total Qualification Time rounded to the nearest whole number

Assessment

This qualification will be internally and externally assessed using a range of assessment methods as set out in table 1 below:-

Grading of the Qualification

All assessment tasks required for each unit of the qualification (detailed in table 1 of the specification) must be completed and awarded a Pass mark before the complete qualification can be certificated

The overall qualification is graded - Pass

Controlled Assessment

All practical assessments must be conducted in a controlled environment as defined by ITEC [here](#). The internal assessments will be conducted by the Centre's Assessor/Internal Verifier(s) and will be sampled by the ITEC External Verifier; however, the Centre is responsible for ensuring the assessment can operate seamlessly by organising the process as defined by ITEC in the Lecturer/Assessor Guidance Notes [here](#)

Recommended Prior Learning

It is recommended that Learners have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grades A*-C or the ITEC Level 1 Diploma in Hairdressing prior to commencing the ITEC Level 2 Award in The Art of Dressing Hair however, exemptions may be made for adult returners with experience of the workplace

Opportunities for Progression

Once Learners have achieved the ITEC Level 2 Award in The Art of Dressing Hair they may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 2, for example:

- Level 2 Award in Cutting Women's Hair
- Level 2 Diploma in Hairdressing
