



ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Make-up QAN 501/0199/7 Specification

Aims and Objectives

The main aim of the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Make-up is to enable Learners to gain the necessary practical and theoretical skills in order to provide Make-up treatments to the general public and to gain employment in the Industry. This qualification is suitable for Learners aged 16 and over and is designed to provide occupational competence at Level 2. It also provides a sound platform into further training at Level 3

Content

This qualification is for Learners who want to work within the Make-up Industry. The qualification consists of 4 mandatory units with a total of 114 hours of Guided Learning (GL) to achieve the full qualification

The main skills the Learner will perform are:

- Make-up application to include the understanding of face shapes and full make-up application

The Learner will also develop knowledge about related health and safety and client care and communication which is essential to work and be successful in the Industry

This qualification also provides:

- The related knowledge and understanding required to perform the make-up treatments listed above as well as understanding the structures you are working over in particular recognition of skin types, skin diseases and reasons that may affect whether a client should or should not be treated
- Opportunities for Learners to focus on the development of their wider skills in a make-up setting, such as communicating with clients, working with others and problem solving
- Opportunities for Learners to develop a range of skills, techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for successful performance in employment as a Make-up Artist

Why Choose the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Make-up?

1. This Qualification combines the full range of skills and knowledge for the Learner seeking employment or self-employment as a Make-up Artist at Level 2. There are other ITEC Diplomas and Certificates at Level 2 that contain Make-up, however they also contain the skills for performing facial skincare, nail treatments, depilatory waxing and photographic Make-up. This qualification enables the Learner to specialise in applying Make-up ready for employment in the industry
2. This Qualification is listed in the Ofqual Register of Qualifications
3. This Qualification contains all the skills and knowledge required for employability at Level 2
4. Learners may progress on to the ITEC Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy Treatments, an Apprenticeship at either Level 2 or 3 or a Technical Level Qualification at Levels 2 or 3, such as the ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Beauty Specialist Treatments or the ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Massage and Electrotherapy Treatments
5. This qualification does not form part of an Apprenticeship

6. This qualification is recognised by all relevant professional bodies within the Beauty Therapy Industry for membership and insurance purposes at Level 2

Guided Learning (GL)

Guided Learning is 'the activity of a Learner in being taught or instructed by – or otherwise participating in education or training under the immediate guidance or supervision of – a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'. This includes 'the activity of being assessed if the assessment takes place under the Immediate guidance or supervision of a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'

Total Qualification Time (TQT)

Total Qualification Time is the number of notional hours which represents an estimate of the total amount of time that could reasonably be expected to be required in order for a Learner to achieve and demonstrate the achievement of the level of attainment necessary for the award of the qualification

Total Credit Value

The total Credit Value for the qualification is equal to one tenth of the Total Qualification Time rounded to the nearest whole number.

This qualification will be internally and externally assessed using a range of assessment methods as set out in the table below:-

Grading of the Qualification

All assessment tasks required for each unit of the qualification (detailed in table 1 of the specification) must be completed and awarded a Pass mark before the complete qualification can be certificated

The overall qualification is graded, Pass - 60% - 74%, Merit - 75% - 89%, Distinction – 90%-100%. This is formed by the aggregate of the multiple-choice questions and the Final Practical Assessment

Controlled Assessment

All theory tests must be conducted in a controlled environment and follow the procedures defined by ITEC [here](#). The theory tests will be set and marked by ITEC

All practical assessments must be conducted in a controlled environment as defined by ITEC [here](#). The practical examination will be conducted by an ITEC Examiner; however, the Centre is responsible for ensuring the examination can operate seamlessly by organising the process as defined by ITEC in the Lecturer Guidance Notes [here](#). Recommended Prior Learning

It is recommended that Learners should have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grade A*-C or a Level 1 Diploma in Beauty Therapy prior to commencing the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Make-up; however, exemptions may be made for adult returners with experience of the workplace

Opportunities for Progression

Once Learners have achieved the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Make-up they may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 2 or 3, for example:

- Level 2 Diploma in Hair, Photographic and Media Make-up
- Level 3 Diploma in Beauty Therapy
- Level 3 Diploma in Massage and Electrotherapy Treatments
- Level 3 Diploma in Spa and Body Treatments
- Level 3 Diploma in Nail Treatments
- Level 3 Diploma in Fashion and Specialised Make-up
