Lecturer Guidance Notes

General Advice

1. Requirements for Undertaking this Qualification

It is recommended that Learners should have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grade A*-C or a Level 1 Diploma in Beauty Therapy prior to commencing the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Threading; however, exemptions may be made for adult returners with experience of the workplace

A scheme of work must be approved by ITEC prior to the commencement of the course for all units

2. Structure of the Qualification, Guided Learning (GL), Total Qualification Time (TQT) and Credit Value

The ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Threading is comprised of 4 mandatory units with a total of 102 hours of Guided Learning (GL) in order to achieve the full qualification

Guided Learning (GL) – 102

Guided Learning is 'the activity of a Learner in being taught or instructed by – or otherwise participating in education or training under the immediate guidance or supervision of – a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'. This includes 'the activity of being assessed if the assessment takes place under the immediate guidance or supervision of a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'

Total Qualification Time (TQT) – 126

Total Qualification Time is 'the number of notional hours which represents an estimate of the total amount of time that could reasonably be expected to be required in order for a Learner to achieve and demonstrate the achievement of the level of attainment necessary for the award of the qualification'

Total Credit Value - 13

The total Credit Value for the qualification is equal to one tenth of the Total Qualification Time rounded to the nearest whole number

3. Delivery of the Qualification

Lecturers should aim to deliver the theory and practical of each unit simultaneously, i.e., both theory and practical of each unit should be taught together to ensure the underpinning knowledge is being delivered at the same time as the practical skills. This will help to ensure that Learners understand the structures they are working on as a result of combining delivery with the practical application of treatments

4. Assessment and Grading of the Qualification

Learner's results and Certificates will be issued by ITEC directly to the Centre. Learners should be notified that they need to collect their results and Certificates from their Centre

This qualification will be internally and externally assessed using the assessment of skills as set out in Table 1 below. The assignments, the internal practical assessment and treatment evidence/portfolio of evidence will be internally assessed by the Centre's Lecturer/Internal Verifier(s) and verified by ITEC

5. Grading of the Qualification

All assessment tasks required for each unit of the qualification (detailed in Table 1 above) must be completed and awarded a Pass mark before the complete qualification can be certificated

The overall qualification is graded - Pass - 60% - 74%, Merit - 75% - 89%, Distinction – 90%-100%. This is formed by the aggregate of the multiple-choice questions and the Internal Practical Assessment

6. Assessment of the Qualification

The ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Threading will be internally and externally assessed using a variety of assessment methods as set out in Table 1 above

Once the Learner has completed all the specified assessments for the qualification and has been awarded a Pass mark for all the evidence submitted, the Learner will have a Final Internal Practical Assessment carried out by the Centre's Lecturer/Internal Verifier(s) and verified by ITEC who will also verify a sample of all the Learner's evidence that they have completed during their training to ensure it meets the ITEC standard

Internal Practical Assessment

- a. The Internal Practical Assessment forms part of the internal assessment and should be assessed by the Lecturer using the appropriate marking criteria and Internal Practical Assessment Forms
- b. The Internal Practical Form for each unit should be completed by the Lecturer and placed with the relevant documentation for the ITEC External Verifier
- c. Unit 815 will be internally practically assessed
- d. The internal assessment(s) will be conducted by the Centre's Lecturer/Internal Verifier(s) and will be sampled by the ITEC External Examiner

Multiple-choice Tests

Each question is formatted in the same way:

- 1 stem (the question)
- 1 key (the correct answer)
- 3 distractors (incorrect answers)
- The Learner must indicate the answer they believe is correct by placing a mark in the appropriate box on the answer sheet

Multiple-choice tests are used for unit 600 - Online testing of all relevant units is also available

Assignments

- a. The assignments form part of the internal assessment and should be assessed throughout the training by the Lecturer using the appropriate Guidance Forms
- b. Assignments must be completed in the Learner's own time. The Lecturer must monitor the quality of the documentation throughout the Learner's training to ensure that they meet the ITEC criteria. The criteria is detailed on the Assignment Guidance and Assessment Forms
- c. The Assessment Forms for each unit should be completed and placed with the relevant documentation for verification by the ITEC External Examiner
- d. Units 815, 818 and 819 will be assessed by an assignment

Treatment Evidence/Portfolio of Evidence

Evidence of treatments/Portfolio of evidence is required to be completed under the supervision of a Lecturer who must monitor the quality of the treatments performed throughout the Learner's training to ensure that they meet the ITEC criteria

- The criteria are detailed on the Treatment Evidence/Portfolio of Evidence Guidance Forms. They are graded Pass or Refer
- The evidence is formed by a completed Consultation Form. This can be stored in the ITEC E-portfolio

7. Resources

The organisation delivering the qualification must provide a suitable environment for teaching the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Threading as well as all equipment both fixed and free standing to complete all aspects of the qualification. Learners need to be made aware of the amount of consumables/towels they will be required to provide

8. Registration

Enrolments for the qualification and all units should be sent to ITEC together on the ITEC Enrolment Form – paper based or online

9. Opportunities for Progression

Once Learners have achieved the ITEC Level 2 Certificate in Threading they may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 2 or 3, for example:

- Level 2 Diploma for Beauty Specialists
- Level 2 Certificate in Beauty Consultancy
- Level 2 Certificate in Facial Skincare
- Level 2 Certificate in Eyelash and Eyebrow Treatments
- Level 2 Certificate in Make-up

- Level 2 Certificate in Pedicure
- Level 2 Certificate in Waxing
- Level 2 Certificate in Sugaring
- Level 3 Diploma in Beauty Therapy
