Learner Guidance Notes

General Advice

1. Requirements for Undertaking this Qualification

ITEC recommend that you should have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grade A*-C or Level 2 Diploma in Beauty Therapy prior to commencing the ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Fashion and Media Make-up; however, your Centre may make exemptions for adult returners with experience of the workplace.

2. Structure of the Qualification, Guided Learning (GL)

The ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Fashion and Media Make-up is comprised of 10 mandatory units with a total of 430 hours of Guided Learning (GL) in order to achieve the full qualification. However, you will also be required to complete further study and generate evidence of your learning in your own time. This is known as Total Qualification Time (TQT), please see Table 1 below:-

3. Grading of the Qualification

All assessment tasks required for each unit of the qualification (detailed in Table 1 above) must be completed and awarded a Pass mark before the full qualification can be certificated

The overall qualification is graded - Pass - 60% - 74%, Merit - 75% - 89%, Distinction – 90%-100%. This is formed by the aggregate mark for the multiple-choice questions papers and the Final Practical Examination

Your results and Certificates will be sent to your Centre by ITEC. Therefore, you will need to collect your results and Certificates from your Centre

4. Assessment of the Qualification

The ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Fashion and Media Make-up will be internally and externally assessed using a variety of assessment methods as set out in Table 1 above

Once you have completed all the specified assessments for the qualification and your Lecturer has awarded a Pass mark for all the evidence you have submitted, you will have a Final External Practical Examination carried out by an ITEC Examiner, who will also verify a sample of all the evidence you have completed during your training to ensure it meets the ITEC standard

Practical Examination Sequence

Once all aspects of the mandatory units have been completed, you will complete a Final Internal Practical Assessment. This will be observed by your Lecturer using the ITEC Internal Assessment forms. The results will be reviewed by the ITEC External Examiner on the day of your Final External Practical Examination

- a. You will perform the following treatments in sequence for your internal and external practical examinations:
- b. Practical examination sequence – approximately 2 ½ hours

You will need to supply 2/3 clients, one for Make-up, one for Photographic Make-up and the other for Character Make-up that can receive all the following treatments in order to complete your examination (N.B. If you are using the same client for Make-up and Photographic Make-up, the procedure for Units 803 and 834 should be as follows: The client should have clean skin, you would then apply Day Make-up then re-cleanse prior to the application of Photographic Make-up)

Unit 803, Apply Make-up, approximately 30 minutes

- Light day make-up suitable for your client
- Remove head band/hair protection prior to examiner final check

Unit 834 – Fashion and Photographic Make-up, approximately 1-½ hours

- Apply Photographic Make-up on a pre-cleansed client - approximately 30 minutes
- Using a new client, already prepared with costume/hair/bald cap, apply Character Make-Up – approximately 1 hour

- c. You will be asked oral questions during the Final Practical Examination
- d. You will need to complete Consultation Forms for your client for each unit of the ITEC External Examination. They should be reviewed and completed at the end of the treatment and will be taken away by the Examiner
- e. You will need to demonstrate excellent hygiene and client care throughout your examination as well as competence in all your skills
- f. The ITEC Examiner may reduce the treatment timings, as the examination is a demonstration of your professionalism and your accomplished skills

Internal Practical Assessment/Internal Task Assessment

- a. The internal practical assessment forms part of the internal assessment and should be assessed by the Lecturer using the appropriate marking criteria and Internal Practical Assessment Forms
- b. The internal practical form for each unit should be completed by the Lecturer and placed with the relevant documentation for the ITEC External Examiner
- c. Units 838, 923, 836, 807 and 811 will be internally practically assessed
- d. The internal assessment(s) will be conducted by the Centre's Lecturer/Internal Verifier(s) and will be sampled by the ITEC External Verifier

Multiple-choice Tests

Each question is formatted in the same way:

- 1 stem (the question)
- 1 key (the correct answer)
- 3 distractors (incorrect answers)
- You must indicate the answer you believe is correct by placing a mark in the appropriate box on your answer sheet

Multiple-choice tests are used for units 834, 803 and 613 - Online testing of all relevant units is also available

Assignments

- Units 923, 838, 836, 807, 811 and 821 are assessed by the completion of an assignment
- Your assignments form part of your internal assessment and should be assessed throughout your training by your Lecturer using the ITEC Guidance Forms
- The criteria for the assignments are detailed on the Assignment Guidance and Assessment Form
- Your Lecturer will complete the ITEC Assessment Forms and ensure they are ready for verification by the ITEC External Examiner
- The internal assessment(s) will be conducted by the Centre's Lecturer/Internal Verifier(s) and will be sampled by the ITEC External Verifier

Treatment Evidence/Portfolio of Evidence

You are required to provide evidence of treatments that you have performed on clients during your training under the supervision of your Lecturer who will monitor the quality of your treatments in order to ensure that they meet the ITEC criteria

- The criteria are detailed on the Treatment Evidence Guidance Forms. They are graded Pass or Refer
- You will need to complete a Client Consultation Form as evidence that you performed the required number of treatments during your training (see Table 1) as they form part of your internal assessment for the qualification. They can be stored in your ITEC E-portfolio

5. Resources

Your Centre must provide a suitable environment for teaching the ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Fashion and Media Make-up as well as all equipment both fixed and free standing to complete all aspects of the qualification. You may need to supply some consumables and/or towels in order to complete your training

6. Opportunities for Progression

Once you have achieved the ITEC Level 3 Diploma in Fashion and Media Make-up you may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 3 or 4, for example:

- Level 3 Diploma in Nail Technology
- Level 3 Diploma in Advanced Beauty Therapy
- Level 3 Certificate in Facial Electrical Treatments
- Level 3 Certificate in Body Treatments
- Level 4 Diploma in Spa and Salon Management
