



ITEC Level 3 Certificate in Massage **QAN 600/6671/4** **Learner Guidance Notes**

General Advice

1. Requirements for Undertaking this Qualification

ITEC recommend that you should have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grade A*-C or Level 2 Diploma in Complementary therapies prior to commencing the ITEC Level 3 Certificate in Massage; however, your Centre may make exemptions for adult returners with experience of the workplace

2. Structure of the Qualification, Guided Learning (GL)

The ITEC Level 3 Certificate in Massage is comprised of 1 mandatory unit with a total of 112 hours of Guided Learning (GL) in order to achieve the full qualification. However, you will also be required to complete further study and generate evidence of your learning in your own time. This is known as Total Qualification Time (TQT), please see Table 1 below:-

3. Grading of the Qualification

All assessment tasks required for each unit of the qualification (detailed in Table 1 above) must be completed and awarded a Pass mark before the full qualification can be certificated

The overall qualification is graded - Pass - 60% - 74%, Merit - 75% - 89%, Distinction – 90%-100%. This is formed by the aggregate mark for the multiple-choice questions papers and the Final Practical Examination

Your results and Certificates will be sent to your Centre by ITEC. Therefore, you will need to collect your results and Certificates from your Centre

4. Assessment of the Qualification

The ITEC Level 3 Certificate in Massage will be internally and externally assessed using a variety of assessment methods as set out in Table 1 above

Once you have completed all the specified assessments for the qualification and your Lecturer has awarded a Pass mark for all the evidence you have submitted, you will have a Final External Practical Examination carried out by an ITEC Examiner, who will also verify a sample of all the evidence you

have completed during your training to ensure it meets the ITEC standard

Practical Examination Sequence

Once all aspects of the mandatory units have been completed, you will complete a Final Internal Practical Assessment. This will be observed by your Lecturer using the ITEC Internal Assessment Forms. The results will be reviewed by the ITEC External Examiner on the day of your Final External Practical Examination

- a. You will perform the following treatments in sequence for your Internal and External Practical Examinations:
- b. Practical Examination sequence – approximately 45 minutes

You will need to supply a client that can receive all the following treatments in order to complete your examination:-

Unit 380 – Provide Body Massage for Complementary Therapies

- Consultation must be carried out prior to the examination
 - Your client should be on the couch ready for the examination
 - The ITEC External Examiner will see massage performed on one arm, one leg (front and back), abdomen, back, chest, neck, face and scalp in whatever order the Learner has been taught
 - Your client should be helped off the couch
- c. You will be asked oral questions during the Final Practical Examination
 - d. You will need to complete Consultation Forms for your client for each unit of the ITEC External Examination. They should be reviewed and completed at the end of the treatment and will be taken away by the Examiner
 - e. You will need to demonstrate excellent hygiene and client care throughout your examination as well as competence in all your skills
 - f. The ITEC Examiner may reduce the treatment timings, as the examination is a demonstration of your professionalism and your accomplished skills

Treatment Evidence/Case Studies

You are required to provide evidence of treatments that you have performed on clients during your training under the supervision of your Lecturer who will monitor the quality of your treatments in order to ensure that they meet the ITEC criteria

- The criteria are detailed on the Treatment Evidence Guidance Forms. They are graded Pass or Refer
- You will need to complete a Client Consultation Form as evidence that you performed the required number of treatments during your training (see Table 1) as they form part of your internal assessment for the qualification. They can be stored in your ITEC E-portfolio

5. Resources

Your Centre must provide a suitable environment for teaching the ITEC Level 3 Certificate in Massage as well as all equipment both fixed and free standing to complete all aspects of the qualification. You may need to supply some consumables and/or towels in order to complete your training

6. Opportunities for Progression

Once you have achieved the ITEC Level 3 Certificate in Massage you may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 3 or 4, for example:

- Level 3 Diploma in Massage
- Level 3 Diploma in Reflexology

- Level 3 Diploma in Aromatherapy
- Level 3 Diploma in Spa Treatments
- Level 4 Diploma in Sports Massage Therapy
- Level 4 Diploma in Salon and Spa Management or a Degree in Management at University
