

ITEC Unit 660 Assist with Relaxing Services

<p>What this unit is about:</p>	<p>This unit is about the basic skills of removing chemical relaxers and normalising relaxed hair. The work will be carried out under the direction of the Stylist.</p> <p>To carry out this unit, you will need to maintain health, safety and hygiene throughout your work. You will also need to maintain a professional personal appearance and demonstrate good communication skills.</p> <p>The main outcomes of this unit are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. maintain effective and safe methods of working when assisting with relaxing services 2. remove chemical relaxers and normalise the hair
<p>Evidence Requirements:</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Simulation is not allowed for any performance evidence within this unit. 2. You must practically demonstrate in your everyday work that you have met the standard for assisting with relaxing services for hair. 3. Your Assessor will observe these aspects of your performance on at least 2 occasions. 4. From the range, you must show that you have: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - used both types of normalising products 5. If the range requirement has not been fully covered by these observations you may be able to provide additional observed evidence.
<p>What you must do: (Performance Criteria)</p>	<p>Maintain Effective and Safe Methods when Assisting with Relaxing Services</p> <p>P1 maintain your responsibilities for health and safety throughout the service</p> <p>P2 prepare your client to meet salon's requirements</p> <p>P3 protect your client's clothing throughout the service</p> <p>P4 wear personal protective equipment when using chemical relaxers</p> <p>P5 position your client to meet the needs of the service without causing them discomfort</p> <p>P6 ensure your own posture and position whilst working minimises fatigue and the risk of injury</p> <p>P7 keep your work area clean and tidy throughout the service</p> <p>P8 use working methods that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - P8.1 minimise the wastage of normalising shampoo - P8.2 minimise the risk of cross-infection - P8.3 make effective use of your working time - P8.4 ensure the use of clean resources - P8.5 minimise the risk of harm or injury to yourself and clients <p>P9 ensure your personal hygiene, protection and appearance meets accepted industry and organisational requirements</p> <p>P10 follow workplace and suppliers or manufacturers' instructions for the safe use of equipment, materials and products</p> <p>P11 follow stylists' instructions throughout the service</p>

	<p>P12 dispose of waste materials</p> <p>P13 replenish low levels of resources, when required, to minimise disruption to your own work and to clients</p>
	<p>Remove Chemical Relaxers and Normalise Hair</p> <p>P14 remove chemicals in a way which minimises the risk of damage to the hair and scalp</p> <p>P15 ensure your working methods minimise the risk of chemicals being spread to the client's skin, clothes and surrounding areas</p> <p>P16 adapt the water temperature, pressure and direction to protect the hair and scalp condition</p> <p>P17 leave the hair and scalp clean and free from chemicals and excess moisture</p> <p>P18 refer any problems to the relevant person for action</p> <p>P19 blot the hair to remove excess moisture prior to the application of normalising products</p> <p>P20 prepare and apply the normalising products following manufacturers' and stylists' instructions</p> <p>P21 leave the hair free from all traces of the neutralising product</p> <p>P22 apply and remove conditioner, when used, following the manufacturers' and stylists' instructions</p>
