4) Understand and recognise any causes of damage from previous nail enhancement	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ridging • Shedding • Separation • Infection • Hang nail • Biting/picking • Damaged cuticle • Holes in nail plate • Bacterial infection of the nail • Dehydration • Mould • Discolouration • Sepsis
5) Understand and recognise any contra-actions which may occur during and after the course of treatment and how to deal with them	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allergic reaction • Overexposure • Bacterial infections • Fungal infections • Onycholysis • Lifting of the product • Premature loss of extension • Breaking or splitting of natural nail extension • Yellowing of natural nail or nail extension

8) Understand and explain the theory behind the selection of the appropriate nail art system to use	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tips • Acrylic • Gel silk • Fibreglass • Ensuring the condition of the client's nails are considered • Ensuring that the length of the nail has been discussed • Consideration of time available • Consideration of the charge to client
9) Understand and explain hygiene procedures	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wiping the client's hands and nails with sanitiser before treatment • Ensuring all implements are sterilized appropriately before and after use • Waste is placed immediately in the bin • Ensure that plenty of consumables are available
10) Understand and explain how to plan and design a selection of nail art images	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suitable research and resources • Planning and creating a nail art design • Taking into account: • Budget • Health and safety • Environment • Involvement and management of other individuals • Venue • Management of all resources • Review of the design plan and adaptation where necessary • Ensure correct depth and proportion of the image • Use of media for the final image To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accessories • Clothes • Makeup
11) Understand, explain and demonstrate use of the following products and tools:	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Files • Buffers • Scissors • Clippers • Coloured gel • Coloured Acrylic • Airbrushing • 3D • Embedding • Cut outs • Piercing tools
12) Understand, explain and demonstrate an understanding of how to select the correct nail art technique	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coloured gel • Coloured Acrylic • Airbrushing • 3D • Embedding • Variety of designs • Cut outs • Condition of the client's nails • Cost to the client • Nail art should be performed for the following: • Photographic • Fashion shows • Competition work • Client specifications
13) Understand explain and demonstrate the application of the nail art technique	To include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Confirm client choice or select nail art appropriate for the situation (photographic, fashion, competition work, client

	<p>specifications)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use products according to manufacturers instructions • Remove any previously applied product • File the nails correctly to achieve maximum strength, appearance and longevity, by use of correct nail balance and shaping particularly when applying tips • Ensure the cuticles are tidy and the nail is free from debris • Apply the nail art base • Apply nail art products in the correct sequence • Seal the nail art ensure that the cuticles are free from any product <p>To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coloured Gel • Coloured Acrylic • Tips • Airbrushing • 3D • Embedding • Cut outs • Blending and mixing of colours • Ensuring that correct hygiene is observed throughout • Ensuring that any resin is applied correctly, evenly and not on the skin
14) Understand and explain the concept of nail enhancements and when and why they would be appropriate	<p>To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tips • Gel • Silk • Fibreglass and Acrylic • Tips are applied when the nails require length • The four overlays can be applied over tips or natural nails to increase strength and durability
15) Understand, explain and demonstrate the application of acrylic and gel to build a coloured nail	<p>To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensuring the nail has been correctly prepared • Ensuring that the product is not too thick and evenly distributed
16) Understand, explain and demonstrate how to use minimum correction to ensure a good finished result	<p>To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Importance of leaving a hairline gap • Checking the finished result with the client
17) Understand, explain and demonstrate how to work within time limits acceptable to industry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that a set of nails can be completed in a commercially acceptable time • Application must be cost effective • Minimum wastage of product and consumables • Ensure the image meets the design plan • Use media where appropriate
18) Understand, explain and demonstrate how to update client records accordingly	<p>To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checking details from previous visit and noting any changes particularly any contraindications • Noting the condition of the nails • Noting the system used
19) Understand, explain and demonstrate knowledge of aftercare	<p>To include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Range and use of home care products • Protection of any artificial structures • Accidental damage • Appointment is made for further treatments • Avoidance of activities which may cause damage to the nail art
