
Marking Criteria

iUBT427 – Skincare and eye treatments

Once all aspects of the mandatory units have been completed, learners will be expected to complete an internal practical assessment. This will be undertaken by an internal assessor using the internal assessment forms. These must be handed to the external examiner on the day of the final external practical examination.

Practical examination sequence – approximately 1 hour 15 minutes

- Consultation forms may be partially filled out prior to the practical examination
- Clients must be wearing full day make-up
- Cleanse (7 minutes)
- Tone
- Skin analysis
- Eyelash tint
- Eyebrow shape
- Massage (10 minutes)
- Mask (two masks must be applied simultaneously on the appropriate areas of the face and neck, to include one self-mixed mask and one prepared commercial mask)
- Moisturise
- Oral questions may be asked at any time during the examination
- Consultation forms must be filled in by each learner and made available for the external examiner to check. These should be reviewed and completed at the end of the treatment and will be taken away by the examiner
- Learners will be expected to demonstrate excellent hygiene and client care throughout as well as competence in their relevant skills
- The external examiner may reduce the treatment timings, as the examination is a demonstration of the learner's professionalism and their accomplished technique
- Approximate time allocated for changeover of practical examination groups – 15 minutes

Learners must achieve a minimum of 3 marks for appearance and 3 marks for client care in order to pass the practical examination.

Learners must be able to demonstrate the following:

Appearance – 5 marks (0.5 marks each)

1. Clean, ironed professional uniform
2. Clean, neat hair, tied back/up if long and off the collar and face
3. Short, clean, well-manicured nails with no varnish and clean hands
4. Clean, sensible full flat shoes, socks should be worn
5. Tights are an appropriate colour for the uniform, if wearing a skirt
6. No jewellery – with the exception of a wedding band and 1 pair of small stud earrings (religious jewellery must be taped)
7. No body or breath odour

8. No chewing gum or sucking sweets
9. No visible underskirts/underwear
10. Skirts to the knee, trousers cropped no higher than calf/trousers not trailing on the floor

Client care – 5 marks (1 mark each)

1. Greeted and introduced self to client
2. Assisted client on and off the couch as appropriate
3. Explained the treatment procedure to the client
4. Ensured the client's comfort/modesty throughout
5. Maintained a positive and professional approach to client throughout

Hygiene and sterilisation – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Wiped equipment over with appropriate sanitiser before and after use
2. Sanitised hands before, during and after treatment as appropriate
3. Replaced lids on products and used spatulas to remove creams
4. Disposed of cotton wool, tissues, paper roll and general waste hygienically and appropriately
5. Used salon/clinic sterilising equipment/cabinets appropriately and sanitised, used and stored small equipment appropriately

Cleanse – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Selected the correct cleanser for the skin type to remove full make-up
2. Removed eye make-up and lipstick efficiently and thoroughly
3. Performed the cleansing routine twice
4. Toned the skin and left it clean and free from cream/lotion
5. Performed the cleanse/tone in a commercially acceptable time

Skin analysis – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Used the magnifying lamp appropriately
2. Recognised any visible skin imperfections/lesions and recorded them
3. Recognised the client's skin type/characteristics
4. Recommended treatments that are suitable for the skin type/characteristics
5. Recommended suitable products for home care

Eyelash tinting – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Was aware of contra-indications and showed evidence that the client has had a patch test
2. Protected surrounding skin and prepared treatment area appropriately
3. Mixed suitable colour to the correct consistency according to the client's wishes and manufacturer's advice, ensuring minimum wastage
4. Applied the tint thoroughly and carefully
5. Removed the tint efficiently and created darkened eyelashes to a commercially acceptable standard

Eyebrow shape – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Discussed the client's requirements
2. Measured the eyebrows accurately
3. Wore gloves and stretched the skin when performing the treatment

4. Positioned self and client correctly, removed hairs quickly and efficiently to a commercially acceptable standard and placed on a tissue or cotton wool
5. Checked for client's comfort throughout and approval of the finished result

Massage – 20 marks (2 marks each)

1. Selected a suitable medium for the massage and applied it appropriately
2. Demonstrated effleurage movements
3. Demonstrated petrissage movements
4. Demonstrated tapotement and vibration movements
5. Demonstrated friction movements
6. Maintained contact and flow throughout the routine
7. Demonstrated appropriate pressure for the client from area to area
8. Maintained the client's comfort throughout
9. Focused on the client throughout
10. Demonstrated appropriate posture throughout

Mask – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Prepared the area appropriately
2. Mixed and applied a self-mixed mask suitable using a suitable recipe for the skin type, and selected and applied an appropriate prepared commercial mask for the client's skin type/specific need
3. Applied both masks evenly, efficiently and minimising waste
4. Understood the effects and benefits of the active ingredients in both masks applied and their contra-indications
5. Removed the masks efficiently and comfortably for the client

Home care advice – 10 marks (2 marks each)

1. Concluded the treatment in an appropriate way
2. Made recommendations for follow-on appointment
3. Made recommendations for immediate aftercare avoiding activities that may cause possible contra-actions
4. Made recommendations for home care advice
5. Informed the client of the short-term effects of the treatment

Sample oral questions

1. Describe the client's skin type?
2. What is vitiligo?
3. What is the cause of vitiligo?
4. What sort of mask would be suitable for this skin type and why?
5. Describe the contra-indications to this treatment
6. What aftercare advice would you give to the client?
