



ITEC Level 4 Diploma in Laser and Intense Pulsed Light Treatments QAN 500/1212/5 Learner Guidance Notes

General Advice

1. Requirements for Undertaking this Qualification

ITEC recommend that you should have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grade A*-C and must hold the ITEC Level 2 Diploma for Beauty Specialists or equivalent prior to commencing the ITEC Level 4 Diploma in Laser and Intense Pulsed Light Treatments; however, your Centre may make exemptions for adult returners with experience of the workplace.

2. Structure of the Qualification, Guided Learning (GL)

The ITEC Level 4 Diploma in Laser and Intense Pulsed Light Treatments is comprised of 1 mandatory unit with a total of 200 hours of Guided Learning (GL) to achieve the full qualification. However, you will also be required to complete further study and generate evidence of your learning in your own time. This is known as Total Qualification Time (TQT), please see Table 1 below:-

Grading of the Qualification

All assessment tasks required for each unit of the qualification (detailed in Table 1 above) must be completed and awarded a Pass mark before the full qualification can be certificated

The overall qualification is graded - Pass - 60% - 74%, Merit - 75% - 89%, Distinction – 90%-100%. This is formed by the aggregate of the multiple-choice questions and the summative internal practical assessment

Your results and Certificates will be sent to your Centre by ITEC. Therefore, you will need to collect your results and Certificates from your Centre

3. Assessment of the Qualification

The ITEC Level 4 Diploma in Laser and Intense Pulsed Light Treatments will be internally and externally assessed using a variety of assessment methods as set out in Table 1 above

Once the Learner has completed all the specified assessments for the qualification and has been awarded a Pass mark for all the evidence submitted, the ITEC External Verifier will verify a sample of all the Learner's evidence that they have completed during their training to ensure it meets the ITEC standard

Practical Examination Sequence

Once all aspects of the mandatory and additional optional units have been completed, Learners will be expected to complete an internal practical assessment. This will be undertaken by the Internal Assessor using the Internal Assessment forms. These must be handed to the ITEC External Examiner on the day of the Final External Practical Examination

- a. Learners will be expected to perform the following treatments:

Practical Skills Examination Sequence – Approximately 1 hour

- Examiner must be shown evidence of patch test and consultation carried out at that time
 - Assist client onto the couch and carry out exam consultation
 - Prepare the area for hair/skin treatment
 - Check the machine
 - Perform a test shot for hair/skin treatment
 - Perform treatment for hair/skin using different models for each treatment
 - Apply aftercare
 - Give home care advice
- b. Oral questions may be asked at any time during the examination
- c. Consultation forms must be filled in by each Learner for each unit and made available for the ITEC External Examiner to check. These should be reviewed and completed at the end of the treatment and will be taken away by the Examiner
- d. Learners will be expected to demonstrate excellent hygiene and client care throughout as well as competence in their relevant skills
- e. The Examiner may reduce the treatment timings, as the examination is a demonstration of the Learner's professionalism and their accomplished technique
- f. Approximate time allocated for changeover of practical examination groups – 15 minutes

Multiple-choice Tests

Each question is formatted in the same way:

- 1 stem (the question)
- 1 key (the correct answer)
- 3 distractors (incorrect answers)
- The Learner must indicate the answer they believe is correct by placing a mark in the appropriate box on the answer sheet

Multiple-choice tests are used for unit 48 - online testing of all relevant units is also available

Treatment Evidence

Portfolio of evidence is required to be completed under the supervision of a Lecturer who must monitor the quality of the treatments performed throughout the Learner's training to ensure that they meet the ITEC criteria

- The criteria are detailed on the Treatment Evidence Guidance Forms. They are graded Pass or Refer
- The evidence is formed by a completed Consultation Form. This can be stored in the ITEC E-portfolio

4. Resources

Your Centre must provide a suitable environment for teaching the ITEC Level 4 Diploma in Laser and Intense Pulsed Light Treatments as well as all equipment both fixed and free standing to complete all aspects of the qualification

5. Opportunities for Progression

Once you have achieved the ITEC Level 4 Diploma in Laser and Intense Pulsed Light Treatments you may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 4 for example:

- Level 4 Diploma in Advanced Skincare
- Level 4 Diploma in Spa and Management
- Level 4 Certificate in Micro-Pigmentation
