



ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing QAN 601/5795/1 Specification

Aims and Objectives

The main aim of the ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing is to enable Learners to gain the necessary practical skills and knowledge in order to provide Hairdressing services to the general public and to gain employment in the Hairdressing Industry. The qualification is suitable for Learners aged 16 and over and is designed to provide occupational competence at Level 2. It also provides a sound platform into further learning at Level 3

Content

This qualification is for Learners who want to work within the Hairdressing Industry. The qualification consists of 7 units, all of which are mandatory; Learners must also select optional units covering a minimum of 77 hours of Guided Learning (GL). A total of between 561-595 hours of Guided Learning are required to achieve the full qualification. The main skills the Learner will perform are:

- Shampoo and Condition Hair – how to massage the hair and scalp correctly to cleanse, condition and treat the client's hair
- Cut Women's Hair – develop basic cutting techniques to create a range of looks and recognition of critical influencing factors associated with cutting hair
- Colour and Lighten Hair – includes developing a range of basic application skills for creating different effects using permanent colour
- Dressing Hair – develop long hairdressing skills to create a variety of looks, including setting and hair up looks
- Reception Duties – cultivate skills that improve delivery of client enquiries, bookings and payments

The Learner will also develop knowledge about related health and safety and client care and communication which is essential to work and be successful in the Hairdressing Industry

The Learner will also be able to choose from a range of optional units to complete the qualification, for example:

- Relax Hair
- Perm and Neutralise Hair
- Plait and Twist Hair
- Temporarily Attach Hair to Enhance a Style
- Remove Hair Extensions
- Fulfil Salon Reception Duties
- Cut Men's Hair Using Basic Techniques

The qualification also provides:

- The related knowledge and understanding required to perform the Hairdressing skills listed above
- Opportunities for Learners to focus on the development of their wider skills in a Hairdressing setting, such as; communicating with clients, working with others and problem solving
- Opportunities for Learners to develop a range of skills, techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for successful performance in employment in the Hairdressing Industry

Why Choose the ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing?

1. This Qualification combines the full range of skills and knowledge for the Learner seeking employment or self-employment as a Hairdresser at Level 2
2. This Qualification is the only ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing that meets the current National Occupational Standards. The new ITEC Level 3 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing supersedes all previous Hairdressing Level 2 NVQ's
3. This Qualification is listed in the Ofqual Register of Qualifications
4. The ITEC Level 2 Diploma in Hairdressing QAN 60157951 is recognised by all relevant professional bodies within the Hairdressing Industry for membership and insurance purposes
5. There are other Hairdressing qualifications available at Level 2, however, they only enable entry into the profession as an improving Hairdresser
 - a. For example, the ITEC Level 2 Diploma in Women's Hairdressing leads to Apprenticeships at Level 2. Within this qualification fewer core Hairdressing elements are mandatory, therefore the qualification does not lead to occupational competence
6. The ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing also forms part of the Level 2 Hairdressing Apprenticeship. This qualification can be studied outside an Apprenticeship by Learners who are unable to gain an Apprenticeship position or are ineligible for an Apprenticeship due to prior qualifications, but wish to be occupationally competent and employed as a Hairstylist
7. The ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing leads to employability and is the employer's preference with support from 7,000 salons, via the National Hairdressers' Federation. It remains the qualification of choice amongst Further Education Colleges as local employers require it for employees

Guided Learning (GL)

Guided Learning is the 'activity of a Learner in being taught or instructed by – or otherwise participating in education or training under the immediate guidance or supervision of – a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'. This includes 'the activity of being assessed if the assessment takes place under the immediate guidance or supervision of a Lecturer, Supervisor, Tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training'

Total Qualification Time (TQT)

Total Qualification Time is the number of notional hours which represents an estimate of the total amount of time that could reasonably be expected to be required in order for a Learner to achieve and demonstrate the achievement of the level of attainment necessary for the award of the qualification

This qualification will be internally and externally assessed using a range of assessment methods as set out in Table 1 and 2 below:-

The overall qualification is graded as a Pass

Controlled Assessment

All practical assessments must be conducted in a controlled environment as defined by ITEC [here](#). The internal assessment will be conducted by the Centre's Assessor/Internal Verifier(s) and will be sampled by the ITEC External Verifier; however, the Centre is responsible for ensuring the assessment can operate seamlessly by organising the process as defined by ITEC in the Lecturer/Assessor Guidance Notes [here](#). Recommended Prior Learning

It is recommended that Learners should have achieved a level of education equivalent to five GCSEs at grade A*-C or a Level 1 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing prior to commencing the ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing; however, exemptions may be made for adult returners with experience of the workplace.

Opportunities for Progression

Once Learners have achieved the ITEC Level 2 NVQ Diploma in Hairdressing they may progress on to other ITEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 2 or 3, for example:

- Level 3 Apprenticeship in Hairdressing
- Level 3 Diploma in Hairdressing
- Level 2 Certificate in Barbering
- Level 3 Certificate in Barbering
- Level 3 Certificate in African Hair Type
