2 About this qualification

2.1 Who is this qualification for?

The VTCT Skills (ITEC) Level 2 Award in Invigilating Remote Tests and Examination is a VRQ aimed at learners aged 16+ who are either in a full-time education programme, a part time programme at a college or with a private training provider, and wish to prepare individuals and centre for the invigilation of remote tests and examinations.

2.2 What does this qualification cover?

The qualification includes one mandatory unit:

- Principles of remote invigilation

Throughout this qualification, learners will develop their knowledge and understanding required to prepare examination rooms and resources, prepare learners for tests and examinations, implement invigilation requirements for internal and external tests and examinations and end tests and examinations. Learners will also explore the requirements for the development of good and bad practice in order to manage and mitigate remote invigilation risk to ensure valid assessment of learning.

2.3 What could this qualification lead to?

Learners undertaking this qualification may wish to progress to other Invigilation training courses, including:

- Invigilating tests and examinations
- Invigilation training for general qualifications

3 Qualification structure

3.1 Qualification structure

To be awarded the VTCT Skills (ITEC) Level 2 Award in Invigilating Remote Tests and Examinations learners must achieve all mandatory units.

The minimum TQT required to achieve this qualification is 9.

3.2 Total Qualification Time (TQT)

TQT is defined under the Ofqual General Conditions of Recognition, General Condition J1.8, as the number of notional hours which represents an estimate of the total amount of time that could reasonably be expected to be required in order for a learner to achieve and demonstrate achievement of the level of attainment necessary for the award of a qualification.

TQT is comprised of the following two elements:

- the number of hours which an awarding organisation has assigned to a qualification for Guided Learning, and
- an estimate of the number of hours a learner will reasonably be likely to spend in preparation, study or any other form of participation in education or training, including assessment, which takes place as directed – but, unlike Guided Learning, not under the immediate guidance or supervision of – a lecturer, supervisor, tutor or other appropriate provider of education or training.

4.2 External assessment

4.2.1 External theory examination

The theory examination will be set and marked by VTCT Skills. The theory examination will consist of multiple-choice questions. Questions will cover all learning outcomes within the mandatory unit. The pass mark for the theory examination will be 70%.

External examinations must be undertaken by learners under controlled examination conditions in accordance with policies and procedures for external assessment which can be found on the VTCT Skills website.

4.2.2 Retaking external theory examinations

Learners who fail to achieve the required Pass mark are permitted to re-sit after having sufficient teaching and additional study time. There is no limit to the number of retakes a learner can carry out. External examinations will be subject to rotation by VTCT Skills. Re-sits are subject to charges as stated in the 'VTCT Skills Service Fees'.

4.2.2 Reasonable adjustments and special considerations

A reasonable adjustment is an adjustment made to an assessment for a qualification that is approved or set in place before an assessment activity takes place; it constitutes an arrangement to give the learner access to the qualification.

4.3 Spot Checking

In addition to the scheduled theory examination, targeted and unannounced spot checks of centres delivering this qualification will be undertaken as part of the awarding organisation's formal quality assurance process.
